Student Network Mentorship Program

The Student Network is excited to announce that we are now accepting applications for the 2014/2015 Student Network Mentorship Program. The Mentorship Program will pair experienced public health law professionals with law and public health students across the country. Students will gain valuable insights beyond classroom education, learn more about the field, and tap into new professionals networks and receive personal advice about job searching, school and resumes. Mentors will have the opportunity to share their passion for public health law, be a guiding influence to an emerging professional, and contribute to the growth of the public health law field.

Mentees get:

- A support system in a unique professional field
- An insider's perspective on your career
- Identification of skills gaps and advice on how to close them
- Expanded networking opportunities

Mentors get:

- Exposure to the emerging talent pool and their perspectives
- Practice in coaching and leadership
- A lasting career network

The Student Network will work with students to match them with a mentor based on current role and area of expertise. The Student Network cannot guarantee that a paired mentor and mentee will be in the same geographic region. Participants should be proactive and comfortable communicating with one another virtually.

Mentorship activities, directed by mentor/mentee pairs, may include career conversations, job shadowing, resume/interview exercises, and networking and connecting. Depending on the location of mentor and mentee, these activities may be carried out over the phone, through video conferencing, or in person.

The Student Network will also offer a number of resources and opportunities for learning to mentors/mentees, including webinars on career and substantive topics and discussion via group calls and social media outlets.

To Apply

Applications will close on July 31, 2014. Applicants will be informed of their matches with mentors/mentees no later than August 27, 2014. The program will run throughout the course of the 2014/2015 academic year and will end on May 31, 2015.
