Every nine minutes, that victim is a child.

Only five out of every 1,000 rapists will end up in prison.

One in ten women will experience IPV sexual assault in her lifetime.


Human Slaves The Trafficking Victims Protection Act 2000

• Sex trafficking: the recruitment, harboring, transportation, provision, or obtaining of a person for the purpose of a commercial sex act, in which the commercial sex act is induced by force, fraud, or coercion or in which the person induced to perform such act has not attained 18

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· Labor Trafficking: the recruitment, harboring, transportation, provision, or obtaining of a person for labor or services, through the use of force, fraud, or coercion for the purpose of subjection to involuntary servitude, peonage, debt bondage, or slavery.

Heat Map of US Human Trafficking The International Labour Organization estimates: 4.0.3 million victims of human trafficking globally. 8.1% of them are trapped in forced labor. 2.5% of them are children. 7.5% are women and girls. 5.150 billion industry worldwide. The U.S. Department of Labor has identified: 1.48 goods from 75 countries made by forced and child labor. 1.0.17, an estimated 1 out of 7 endangered unaways reported to the Validonal Cemer for Missing and Exploited Children were likely child sex trafficking victims. 1. of those, 88% were in the care of social services or foster care when they ran. 





Patient Consent is Sexual Assault Up to 7 days post-assault for adults 3 days post assault for pediatrics Intrimate Partner Violence Assailant must be or have been an intimate partner Trafficking Can be done at any time, for any person Acute assault not a requirement HennepinHealthcare

• Consent • Consent • Consent is obtained from all patients before and during exam • Children must provide assent • Exams are not forced on children who are unwilling to participate • Exam can be modified to accommodate development and level of assent • Altered Mental Status Protocol • Evidence that is at risk of destruction will be collected under implied consent • Stored anonymously until patient gains consciousness • If patient does not regain consciousness, the evidence can be released via subpoena to law enforcement

HART

- Sexual Exploitation/Trafficking
 - Exchange of sex for anything of value or the <u>promise</u> of anything of value
 Third party may or may not be involved
- Safe Harbor Law
 - Treats victims 24 years and younger as VICTIMS instead of criminals
 - Provides dedicated shelters and beds
 - Dedicated services and treatment programs
- Screening tools used by HART
